

BROWN EDGE PARISH COUNCIL

Rules and Regulations for the "Lawn Cemetery" - Amended February 2012

1. All charges and fees to be paid to the Council at the time the order is given, and a receipt obtained.
2. All grave spaces allocated by the Council. No pre-purchase of grave spaces allowed.
3. Notice of interment must be completed on the form provided. Certificate of Registry of Death, Coroner's Order for Burial or Certificate of Cremation for burial of Cremated Remains to be produced.
4. Orders or instructions given by telephone must be confirmed in writing.
5. The Council reserves the right to make alterations in the Table of Fees and Regulations.
6. Records and plan of the Cemetery, showing grave spaces, shall be kept at the office of the "Clerk to the Council", and may be seen without charge by appointment.
7. The layout of grave plots shall be lawn style and must be level with the surrounding ground. No raised mounds allowed and graves must not be surrounded with kerbs or other marks.
8. Memorials in the main cemetery shall NOT EXCEED two feet six inches (76cm.) in width including vase, and the base shall NOT EXCEED fourteen inches (35.5cm.) from back to front. The maximum OVERALL height shall NOT EXCEED two feet nine inches (84cm.). Memorials shall be constructed in durable natural stone, marble or granite.

Memorials in the Garden of Remembrance shall NOT EXCEED twenty inches in height (51cm.), fifteen inches (38cm.) in width and eighteen inches (46cm.) from back to front. A flower vase can be incorporated within these limits.

Only one vase of approved design detached from memorial allowed on each grave space.
9. Drawings of proposed headstone, tablet or vase, with dimensions, and a copy of intended inscription(s) must be submitted for approval by the Council.
10. Masons will be held responsible for any damage done by them or their workmen to the Cemetery or memorials erected within.
11. No glass jars or vases allowed.
12. The Council will not be responsible for damage by gale or wear and tear and circumstances over which it has no control.
13. All vehicles must proceed at walking pace.
14. Children must be in the care of responsible adults. Dogs must be kept on leads.
15. Any person creating disturbances or nuisance, or acts of vandalism appertaining to the Cemetery will be promptly prosecuted.
16. The Council reserves the right to remove any non compliant memorials. This includes any unsafe or dangerous memorials.
17. Cemetery is open from dawn until dusk.
